CHAMPIONSHIP ENTRY

Qualification for Championships

To qualify for a National or State Championship, an Athlete must complete without elimination one Level 3 or higher event within the previous three years with a single, if entering as a single, with a pair, if entering as a pair, or with a team/tandem, if entering a team/tandem. After entry, if an athlete has to withdraw a horse from their multiples combination they may choose to compete in another class with the approval of the Organising Committee.

The following variation has been approved by Federal Council:

Drivers who have completed without elimination at two Level 4 events within the last three years be allowed to compete at any Championship event held until August 2019, providing it is with the same combination they qualified with.

Proof of this qualification must be provided by the competitor to the Organising Committee.

Entries will not be accepted without all of the following information.

- Entry Form
- Payment Receipt
- ACDS Membership number
- Copy of current year membership card or other evidence of membership

Applicable rules:

Apart from entry qualification (see above) the event will be judged under the current Rules for ACDS Rules for Driving Events (effective 1st August 2018) plus any additional conditions in this schedule including:

- Drivers must be full members of the ACDS
- The Organising Committee reserve the right to:
 - ✓ Alter the advertised time
 - ✓ Refuse entry, with/without stating reason/s
 - ✓ May request to sight height certificate
 - ✓ Reallocate a competitor to the appropriate class
 - ✓ Grading will be taken as at close of entries (22 March 2019)
- All horses competing must be ACDS registered.
- Minimum wheel widths apply wheels will be measured.
- If horses not taking part in the official competition are brought to the Dwellingup Club grounds will be an additional charge of \$20.
- All horses must be presented at vet check and have ACDS horse registration number attached to bridle. Please ensure you have a separate bridle for each horse.
- Entry fees are non-refundable after closing date. If a horse or driver is unable to attend due to sickness or accident, an application for refund may be considered by the Organising Committee on production of a medical or veterinary certificate. 20% of entry fees will be retained to cover costs. Requests for refund will not be considered after commencement of the event.


	IMPORTANT INFORMATION				
Arrival and Departure Date	There is no restriction on arrival and departure dates. Please advise Sandy Elliot of early arrivals.				
Water	Murray Club have very limited water. Please wash horses prior to coming to the grounds. Cooling horses after the marathon must be done with a bucket and sponge; there will be sufficient water available for multiple buckets of water. Personal showers are available off site at the Dwellingup recreation facilities.				
Electricity	Murray club relies on a generator for power. No power is available for personal use.				
Vet Checks	All horses/ponies to be presented in open bitted bridles with the ACDS horse registratic number attached to bridle. Competitors/ handlers must be appropriately dresse Competitors/handlers must wear their competitor number to the vet check. Each horse have its own bridle.				
Dressage	There will be a practice area available upon arrival.				
Marathon	The course will be 3 sections with a maximum distance of 18 kms, 8 obstacles. The course is set within a State Jarrah forest. Section E of the course will be officially open for inspection from 12 noon on Friday 19 th April. Competitors will be able to drive motorised vehicles on Section A, D and E subject to weather conditions. Section E is not to be inspected before 6 am or after 6pm (safety). It is highly recommended that horses are fit, and shod or wearing hoof boots.				
Cones	The Cones will be driven as a fault competition. Course may contain a bridge and/or water. Cones course will be officially open for inspection between 8.00am- 9.30 am Monday 22nd April. Cones course is not to be inspected after 6 pm previous day or before 6 am on 22nd April. Competitors must be appropriately attired for the official course inspection. Aprons and whips not necessary.				
Junior Persons (drivers /grooms/others) on Carriages	Any person on a carriage who is under 18 years of age must wear protective headgear in accordance with ACDS by-laws. Grooms for drivers under 16 must be an experienced ACDS member.				
Awards	Rosettes awarded to placegetters (1 st —3 rd) in each competition. Overall 1 st —4 th place. Rugs awarded to class winners. Perpetual trophies will be awarded. The organisers take no responsibility for the loss of awards and/or prizes if recipients do not remain for the award ceremony (at the conclusion of the event). Competitors are expected to be appropriately dressed for awards ceremony.

Camping	There are no powered sites. Generators are to be turned off at 9.30pm and only generators with a quiet motor are permitted.				
Showers & Toilets	Off-site showers are available at Dwellingup recreation centre approx. 2 kms from the Club grounds. Toilets are available at the Murray Club grounds.				
Accommodation	For those not intending to camp, there are plenty of motels/Airbnb establishments within 10km radius. Please make your own arrangements.				







Dogs	Dogs are allowed but must be kept on a leash at all times. No dogs in Club rooms at all. Please clean up after your dogs.		
Yards	Yards will be available — cost \$20 per yard for event (\$10 each per yard for multiples). Allocated on first come first served basis.		
Local Shops	Dwellingup has a small corner store. There is a large shopping centre in Pinjarra 23km away. Dwellingup has a two coffee shops and one hotel. Dwellingup is extremely busy throughout the Easter period. Expect heavy traffic on Saturday and Sunday.		
Helmets	Helmets must be worn on all sections of the marathon and must comply with the ACDS by- law on helmets. If helmets are worn in other parts of the competition, they must comply with the ACDS by-law on helmets		
Kangaroos / Wildlife	Dwellingup grounds has many types of wildlife throughout all sections of the marathon.		
Hikers / Bike Riders	Dwellingup is very busy with mountain push bike riders and hikers. Please be aware when driving your car or horse that bikers and / or hikers may be on the trails.
