CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

The event will be judged under the current ACDS rules for Combined Driving Events plus any additional local conditions as listed.

All Junior Drivers driving a single horse or pony must have attained their 12th birthday, for Pony multiples their 16th birthday & for Horse Multiples, their 18th birthday.

An experienced adult ACDS member must accompany all competitors under the age of 16 years driving a single horse or pony & all competitors 16 or 17 years of age driving a Pony multiple. Grooms must have attained their 10th birthday for singles & 14th birthday for multiples to participate at ACDS events.

Dress for Juniors

All Junior persons (being under 18 years of age) driving or riding on a carriage must wear a securely fastened protective headgear in accordance with ART 928.2.2

During horse inspections it is strongly recommended for Juniors to wear securely fastened protective headgear.

- All drivers must be full financial members of the ACDS.
- All horses must be registered with the ACDS.
- Grading will be as at close of entries.
- Minimum wheel widths apply.
- Entry fees are non-refundable after the closing date, except for driver/horse illness or accident. Refunds will be considered upon supply of relevant medical or veterinary certificate.
- Appeals must be lodged together with \$50 to the event secretary within 30 minutes of the scores being posted. Money will be refunded, unless in the opinion of the Appeals Committee, the appeal is found to be frivolous.
- Dogs are not encouraged at this event, but if brought, must remain on a leash at all times. Owners to clean up after their dogs.
- All yards/horse areas to be free of manure on departure.

From ACDS CDE Rules: 901.7.3 Qualification for Championships To qualify for a National or State Championship, an Athlete must complete without elimination one Level 3 or higher event within the previous three years with a single, if entering as a single, with a pair if entering as a pair, or with a team/tandem, if entering a team/tandem. Before the closing date of entries as listed on the program and entry form for the event, if an Athlete has to withdraw a horse/pony from their multiples combination due to lameness, ill health or injury, the Athlete may choose to compete in another class with the approval of the OC. If this occurs after the closing date of entries as listed on the program and entry form for the event and before the start of the event, a vet certificate must be provided to the Event Secretary. If vetted out at the First Examination and Inspection, an Athlete with a multiple may choose to compete in another class with the approval of the OC.

Perpetual trophies and ribbons / rosettes will be awarded. The organisers take no responsibility for the loss of awards and/or prizes if recipients do not remain for the award ceremony at the conclusion of the event. Place getters are expected to be appropriately dressed for awards ceremonies.

Bicycles, both push and electric, may be used on the grounds however helmet requirements may apply in some areas (as per regulations for public spaces). Powered mobility aids may be used on course in accordance with provisions in CDE Rules. All users of bicycles and powered mobility aids must be mindful of their potential impact on horses and operate these items safely and with respect for others. For the safety of all concerned these items are not permitted in or immediately adjacent to the Horse Inspection area during inspections. Please respect and comply with any reasonable request from Officials in this regard.

The Organising Committee reserves the right to:

- Alter any advertised time.
- Refuse entry, with/without stating reason/s.
- Measure any horse or pony.
- Reallocate a competitor to the appropriate class.
- Penalise competitors for unsafe or cruel practices.
- Only horses/ponies listed on the official entry form can attend this event without prior approval.
